




Better too much than not enough.


This week has been much better. I found it hard the first 2 weeks

2 x Responses for not enough were anonymous. Invited via newsletter to get in touch so that we could contact them to discuss – no contact made and therefore unable to further discuss / support



Organisation for a P6, P1and Nursery child. Co-operation timing

X - struggles due to loss of routine and structure.

Trying to keep them in a routine, focused on school work and away from 'home' distractions such as toys. During the nice weather we have been trying to incorporate learning activities with outdoor play.

Sharing laptops Encouraging child to engage with online chat.

Not being at home to support them. They are doing a very good job managing home schooling I themselves though

Getting them into 'learning' mode and getting them to sit at the table/desk to work.

X has no reading book yet. He will find catching up with the reading difficult once we get the book. Book not required – individual contact made with family and solution reached.

The English and maths given hasn't had any supporting parental information e.g name the shapes (one was a hemisphere but that wasn't listed) or work on proper nouns and possessive nouns - well not every parent would understand what is meant by possession proper nouns or be able to explain that to their child. I have books at home that explain within a page for parents so I can support and steer and check my child's understanding. It's not too hard for any parent but you need to give them the info or provide supporting PowerPoint for kids breaking the info down not just the sheets to be completed. *Discussion with relevant staff and some simple adaptations made.*

Finding the time to support their learning whilst working ourselves. Having tasks that are interesting enough to keep them motivated.

Working independently & staying focused (easily distracted).

Time and skills - ensuring I give them enough support and trying to explain what/how to do some tasks when they are used to doing things in a certain way.

Keeping them focused and getting them to do things they don't like doing.

Keeping him focused on a task, as easily distracted especially as their is a sibling who is not at school and gets to play while his works. Giving him the attention he needs as I'm currently working at home also. Hard when he doesn't know how to do something.

Trying to get my child to work independently and I as I am not great with technology, accessing the appropriate info. Have to say though, I am getting better so this lockdown has been good for something.

My child's concentration levels and having to work from home also

Keeping them interested/ motivated and trying to think of different things to do every day

One eager to take part but i think the easter break stopped the routine so finding it hard to get back into. 2nd no interest at all, not forcing but doing alternate activities eg. Clay modeling, toad research, tadpoles more nature based.

Trying to encourage online work and also the ability to access the files on glow as they often won't load or crash regularly. Ongoing highlighting that the files are all available each week on the school website – class pages

Not being able to contact their teacher directly. Could this be done via teams email? My child settling. How do you do it? Response provided in newsletter under heading of Contact with our Staff

I am not sure how they are being taught to do maths, which I think is different to how I was taught many years ago. *Discussion with relevant staff and some simple adaptations made*.

Keeping enthusiasm going, we tend to start off OK but by the end of the day it's hard. I've tried to do the core literacy, maths and then let her do the idl topics.

Challenging supporting different ages. Overall teams are great but often to busy to check in often. There are plenty of activities in place.

Trying to get my child to do the work allocated to them. Trying to assist them in areas that they struggle without knowing how they have been taught. For example maths although this weeks exercise from booklets cylinder and cubes has been perfect for me to help without causing confusion.

I don't think we are having any challenges as such, we are enjoying it!

It was printing out work, but I now have a printer. Supplies eg paper and stationary, but I have got them now.

You are doing fab.




Nothing more for me
