

It has been really heartening in the month of September to have so many of our middle to upper school **learners volunteer** their services **to lead** school clubs for younger children over break times.


Well done to **Ella Hoey, Maisie Wilson** and **Thea Thompson** – P5 and P6 learners all doing a great job of leading a drama club.

Kids Kitchen – P7 Health and Wellbeing Project

We are delighted to have partnered up with colleagues from South Lanarkshire Council Facilities Services to run a four week Kids Kitchen project for P7. For the past three Tuesdays in September, our P7s have worked with SLC's Chef Robert to learn about health and safety in the kitchen and to implement a variety of food handling skills. Next week, P7 parents will have the opportunity to work with their child 1:1 to complete some food handling together, under the watchful eye of Chef Robert, to complete this fun block of learning.

A gentle reminder for P7 parents that the session will take place on **Tuesday 07 October** – we hope an adult representative from your family can come long to support your P7 child. Please note, we are sorry to say there is a possibility of a timing change – we may need to ask you to come earlier that morning than originally planned. **We know this is not ideal and will confirm as soon as we possibly can.**













Partnership with Lanarkshire Climate Hub – Taste and Grow Project

We were delighted to discover during the summer holidays that we were successful in a bid to work with Lanarkshire Climate Hub in a 'Taste and Grow' project.

So far, this learning has entailed a representative from the Climate Hub coming to work with our P5/6 class to support their learning about locally grown produce and P5/6 have also been treated to a free excursion to Castlebank Horticultural Centre to learn more about this theme, and to gain hands on experiences, including planting their own potatoes which will have grown in time to eat with this year's Christmas dinner!

Making the most of the trip to Castlebank Area

While we had our children out at the Horticultural Centre, we took the opportunity to take advantage of the beautiful local surroundings to extend the children's health and wellbeing, along with their outdoor learning skills.

P5/6 enjoyed having their lunch in the Fairy Dell area close by to the Horticultural Centre, before taking the long walk down by the Falls of Clyde, and taking advantage of the beautiful surroundings to learn more about nature and to apply the skills that they have learned more locally in Lime Walk Woods.

- ✓ Take the time to look over your child's work at Parents' Evening.
- ✓ Participate in the surveys we issue your views matter to us.
- ✓ Get in touch if you have any questions or queries we are here to help maximise your child's potential.
- ✓ Consistently encourage strong attendance.
- **✓** Consistently encourage excellent levels of punctuality.
