School Improvement Plan Update

We continue to make progress with the targets set in this year's <u>School Improvement Plan (click here for a reminder of all priorities)</u>.

During our November in-service, teaching staff undertook training around digital technologies (in support of our latest digital award quest) and support staff looked at interventions to support numeracy and literacy difficulties. Teaching staff also collaborated to plan for projects that allow children to transfer learning into new, unfamiliar contexts.

Moderation with other schools in our Learning
Community is well underway, as are all of our plans
around practitioner enquiry, health and
wellbeing and rights, respect and antidiscrimination. We expect to be able to fully
overtake the targets we have set ourselves for the
year.

In August, we asked for parental volunteers for a **short life working group**, in support of behaviour and health and wellbeing. We were contacted by one volunteer and this meeting will go ahead at 1pm on Wednesday 17 December, involving staff, our parental volunteer and some class representatives. If you would like to participate, please make contact via our school office and we will welcome you onboard.

In June, when we surveyed parents, two selected 'disagree' and three parents selected 'don't know' in response to being asked if their views are taken into account when changes are made in school. Invites such as this give a very clear opportunity for parental views to be taken into account, as do the various surveys that we issue at different points throughout the year, for different reasons. Parents are always warmly encouraged to get involved in these opportunities. Involvement with our Parent Partnership is always encouraged and this offers another avenue for parents to have their views taken into account. Your views are always fully considered and taken into account, whatever the format – formal or informal.

We continue to operate an open door policy and welcome your input, throughout the school year, day to day. Thank you.
